## Late for School / Leaving Early

#### Late for School

During Period 1 – Remind your son / daughter to meet a Principal in the cafeteria to sign in. (Journal and vsware will be edited before student goes to class)

After Period 1 – Sign in takes place in the main office

### PROCEDURES FOR LEAVING SCHOOL

The vsware absence request on the parent app must be completed one day in advance

Students can only be collected at break of class or break times

Students must go to the office to be collected by parent/guardian

The parent /guardian must present in person at the school office and sign student out.

### Uniform & Lockers



Students must be in full school uniform every day except Friday and the day they have PE day or if the student is attending a match.

Parents and Guardians will be contacted if appropriate.



### Settling in – What you can do to help at home

#### HOMEWORK / LEARNING JOURNAL

- Set a regular pattern for homework time. Show interest in work done. Praise good effort.
- Provide a quiet, well-lit place to work.
- Actively help your son/daughter to revise.
- Remove access to mobile phones / TV when doing homework, study and at night-time.



- In the first term, each evening, help your son / daughter to check their timetable regarding homework, books, equipment or notes required for the school next day.
- Check and sign the Learning Journal each week.
- •Keep a copy of the timetable in a visible spot at home.

#### **OTHER TIPS**



• Fill in the absence, late or permission to leave notes on Vsware or in the Learning Journal when relevant.



• Arranging appointments for outside of school time.



• Encourage a healthy lifestyle (sleep, diet, exercise, use of technology)




• Encourage your son / daughter to talk to teachers if in difficulty or confused.

### Cyber bullying - Social Media (Internet Safety Evening - Previous Feedback)

Keeping connected to your teen gets harder, they want independence and privacy. You want communication and to know they are safe. It is about monitoring, creating rules and boundaries and some compromise. You need to have the phone out of the bedroom for sleep...this is huge.
